## WHAT YOU STUDY

International Relations is one of the most exciting and topical fields of study in contemporary politics.

The MIR program at UQ focuses on traditional and contemporary global issues and offers more than 30 courses covering the main elements of International Relations.

Students are able to select courses from areas such as:

- International Relations of the Asia Pacific
- International Politics and Law
- Security and Statecraft
- Globalisation and Development.

As part of the program you can undertake a research thesis.

The Master of International Relations is available as a 16, 24 or 32 unit program (equivalent to two, three or four semesters of full-time study), depending on your undergraduate degree and work experience.

A Graduate Certificate in International Relations is also available.
