

MASTER OF INTERNATIONAL RELATIONS / MASTER OF INTERNATIONAL LAW

Offered for the first time in Queensland from 2017, this unique two-year dual program offers students a rare opportunity to attain two sought-after qualifications through the combined Master of International Relations / Master of International Law.

By studying these programs as a dual, students will acquire two degrees in a shorter timeframe than if studying them individually. They can also be undertaken as separate 18-month programs if preferred.

Suited to both legal and non-legal professionals, students will obtain the expertise of the top-ranked international relations program in Australia (TRIP Survey 2015) through UQ's School of Political Science and International Studies as well as the TC Beirne School of Law - ranked #45 in the world in QS World **University Rankings.**

This exciting new program will provide students with a fascinating insight into some of the most compelling issues facing the world today in areas such as business, diplomacy, international policy, advocacy, negotiation and war.

Taught by a team of international experts, graduates will be equipped with a clear understanding of the ground rules for international political behaviour; how international law facilitates business, shapes crisis, and drives state behaviour; the rules that allow businesses to operate successfully in the international sphere, and the politics that sometimes overrides those rules.

Understanding how state response to crisis is mediated by rules but often challenges them and the strategic, political and legal implications of major international developments are also key concepts that are introduced in the program.

Entry requirements	You will need to meet the entry requirements to both the 24 unit MIR and the 24 unit MILaw. For the MIR, you will need to have a degree with a sequence of study in peace and conflict studies, international relations, political science, sociology, cultural studies, media studies, communication, economics/political economy, anthropology or ethnography with a CPA of 5. For the MILaw, you will need to have an undergraduate degree in law, arts, business commerce or economics with a minimum GPA of 5.
