Master 32 units (4 semesters):

12 units Part A (core)	2 Part B (subject area content)	10 units Part B/C (electives)	8 units part D (introductory)

To enter, students must have a **bachelor degree** in **any discipline** with GPA of 5

Master 24 units (3 semesters):

12 units Part A (core)	2 units Part B (subject area content)	10 units Part B/C (electives)
------------------------	---------------------------------------	-------------------------------

To enter, students must have a **bachelor degree** in **same discipline** with GPA of 5; or a **bachelor degree** in **any discipline** with GPA of 5 and **minimum 3 year's work experience**

Master 16 units (2 semesters):

12 units Part A (core)	4 units Part B (Subject area content)
------------------------	---------------------------------------

To enter, students must have an **honours degree** in **same discipline** with GPA of 5

Note: Part A (core) includes research component

Master of Governance & Public Policy suite:

Graduate Diploma (2 semesters):



Approved degree in any discipline with a GPA of 4.5; or
GCGPP with a GPA of 4.5.

Graduate Certificate (1 semester):



- Students with degree in same discipline take Core courses from Part A, or a mix of Core from Part A and Part B (subject area content); or
- Students without a bachelors degree in the same discipline take introductory courses (Part D)

If using the GCert as a pathway for entry to Masters:

- *Must gain a GPA of at least 5.0*
- Students with a bachelors degree in the same discipline, but who need to improve their GPA to meet the minimum GPA of 5 required for the Masters, can apply for admission to the Masters #24 **with credit**
- Students who do not have a bachelors degree in the same discipline (for example, those with a Bachelor of Engineering, or those who do not have a bachelor degree and were admitted to the GCert on the basis of post secondary study and work experience) can apply for admission to the Masters #24 **but cannot receive credit**. Students without a background (ie a bachelor degree or honours degree in the same discipline) must undertake a total of 32 units (ie 8 units from the GCert + 24 units from the Masters). This is due to Australian Qualifications Framework requirements.
